

Shepaug Valley School was completed in 1971 and designed to provide a quality education for the students of Bridgewater, Roxbury, and Washington, Connecticut and is also a school of choice for students in Sherman, Connecticut. Shepaug is a comprehensive public school grades 6-12 with an enrollment of 473 students, 317 of which are high school students, and 56 faculty members.

Commonly referred to as the Shepaug Experience, the learning community is known for rich and diverse programs, class sizes that maximize student engagement in intellectual pursuits, close relationships between teachers and students, and a reputation for excellence.

In order to uphold our Core Values and achieve our Learner Outcomes, Shepaug features a professionally equipped theater, an Olympic style swimming pool, and a well appointed technology and arts wing designed to introduce our students to a broad range of career, creative, and technological pursuits. The school provides state-of-the-art technology for student and teacher use. The library houses more than 12,500 print volumes, periodicals, and resource materials in a variety of media.

For the third year, Shepaug students will also have the opportunity to participate in an agriscience program, focusing on such topics as equine, animal, and plant systems; power, structural and technical systems; and food production and processing, including sustainable food production.

Covid-19: Shepaug Valley School had in person learning for the entirety of the 2021 school year. Families had the option to choose remote learning.

17th Annual Shepaug World Affairs Forum: Keynote speaker Mark Mazzetti, two-time Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist and author of "The Way of the Knife" a New York Times best-selling account of the secret wars waged by the C.I.A. and Pentagon since the Sept. 11 attacks, joined Shepaug students at the 17th Annual Shepaug World Affairs Forum.

Shepaug Dramatics: Performers earned 15 nominations for the prestigious Halo Awards. In addition to the distinguished awards of *Best Male Standout Performance In A Play* and *Best Male Standout Performance in a Musical,* Shepaug Dramatics earned *Best Original Play* and a *Special Recognition Award* for Student Director.

The Spartan Scope News Production: The Shepaug student news broadcast produces episodes throughout the school year featuring stories highlighting events, student, faculty, and alumni achievements that bring together the Region 12 community.

Shepaug Art Awards:

Shepaug Valley School artists bloomed in the 2021 school year. Student work was celebrated at several juried events including the Washington Art Association's Teen Expo, ASAP's Young Photographers Celebration, and the virtual exhibit at The Judy Black Gallery. One student received 2nd place in The Congressional Art Awards and will have his photograph hung in the Washington D.C. office of Congresswoman Jahana Hayes. Seven students were included at the Scholastic Art Awards exhibition at Hartford Art School, two honored as Gold and Silver Key winners.
